Activity Notes: This weekend is our annual event at Great Trail Council's Camp Manatoc in the huge Training Lodge, a heated building with bunk sleeping rooms, kitchen, & indoor plumbing! We use this weekend as an opportunity to invite area Webelos to visit and camp with our Scout Troop, earn requirements towards the Arrow of Light, and get to know each other as the Webelo families are deciding how Scouting will be a part of their future. While this is a different type of campout than we normally have throughout the year, it is a unique and fun way for the Webelos to be welcomed into our Scouting family as they go through the Klondike Derby type challenges, assist in meal preparations and cleanup, and get a close up and personal look at the Patrol Method in action as it is practiced by our Troop: "boy lead and adult guided." - The weekend's theme is a preparation for Klondike Derby coming up in January. On Saturday we set up Skill stations that will challenge the Webelos and Boy Scouts in different ways of their Scouting knowledge, applications of basic skills, and team building exercises. Challenges include knots/lashings, nature, first aid, orienteering, and fire building, to name a few (some weather permitting).
- Polar Bear Award: If they have proper gear for weather conditions, 2nd year Webelos can earn up to 2 nights towards this award by camping outside! (The award requires total of 4 outdoor days & nights spent camping at Scouting events occurring from November to end of March).
- Christmas Feast: Saturday Dinner is our infamous Turkey and Ham feast prepared by our Troop Committee
- Campfire and Flag Retirement Ceremony: Saturday evening will close out with a fun campfire, followed by a reverent retirement of worn American flags. This is a special ceremony that we invite Webelos to take part in (Feel free to collect and bring any old flags you know of).

Schedule:

Friday:

- Depart at 6:30pm from McDonaldsville UMC: on Wales Road near Strausser intersection, for Camp Manatoc (map included). Webelos will need to coordinate their own riding arrangements in accordance with their own Pack's transportation rules.
- Arrive at Manatoc: we will need to check in at Camp Ranger's office; then go to the Training Lodge. Once we arrive, we will need to unload Troop gear (mainly food!) for the weekend from the Troop trailers. Then personal gear can be unloaded, bunks selected or tents set up. There are two separate sleeping rooms, one for Webelos and one for Adults. We can partition off an area of one of the adult room for any female adults joining us.
- Crackerbarrel and inside fun activities before bed!

Saturday:

- Breakfast EARLY!
- Klondike Derby Challenges (less sledges) starting approximately 10:00 am through dinner
- Lunch approximately noon
- Christmas Feast: approximately 5:00 pm
- Campfire

Sunday:

- Breakfast EARLY!
- Lodge clean up and packing trailer
- Vespers, closing, and Departure back to McDonaldsville UMC at approximately noon.

Fees:

To provide for adequate supervision, we MUST require a 1-to-2 adult to Webelo ratio at all times!

- **\$20.00 per person**, which includes all weekend costs for 2nd Year/Senior Webelos & adults.
- **\$15.00 per person**, which includes Saturday only costs for 1st Year/Junior or 2nd/Sr. Webelos & adults. This is for Saturday only, with the exception of breakfast. Activities begin on Saturday about 10:00 am and go until completion of Flag Retirement Ceremony.

In order to adequately prepare for food and facility needs, registrations turned in **PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 20th**. Please completely fill out for each person attending (Webelos & adults) the last page of this form and mail it with payment to Kevin Irwin 7412 Diamondback Ave. NW, Canal Fulton, 44614.

Note: There is an occupancy limitation to the cabin and last year we filled it up – so please register early to make sure you get in! Only a certain amount of food will be purchased for registrations received by deadline – walkups are welcome and door fees apply, but meal priorities will be given to registered participants, we can't promise there'll be enough food for you.

Webelo leaders/parents will be responsible for dispensing any medications to Webelos required for the duration of their attendance.

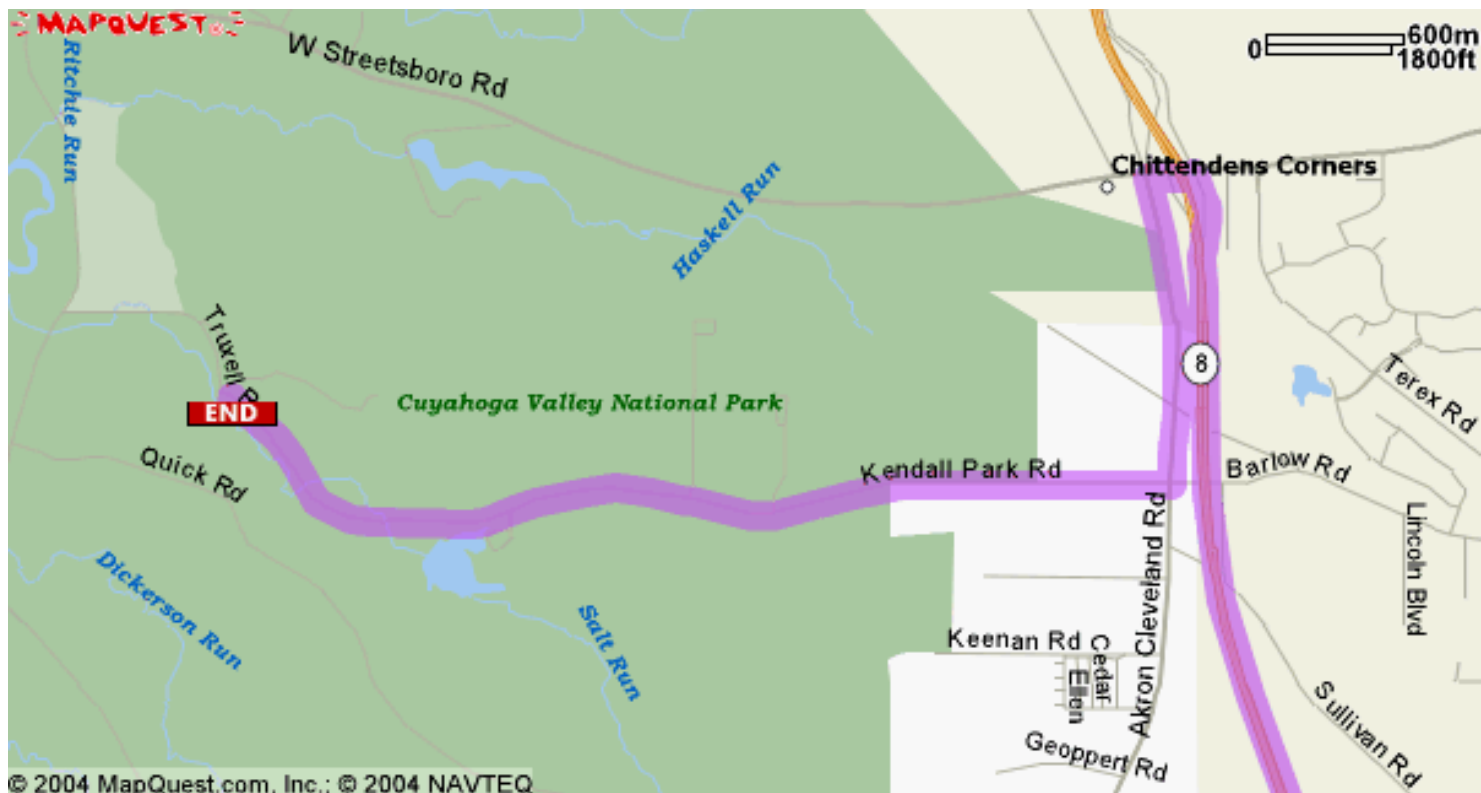

1. Start out going North on OH-241/WALES AVE NW toward STRAUSSER ST NW. Continue to follow OH-241. 5.4 miles
 - NORTH
77
2. Merge onto I-77 N via the ramp- on the left. 12.6 miles
 - NORTH
8
3. Merge onto OH-8 N via exit number 125A- on the left- toward CUYAHOGA FALLS. 8.9 miles
 - EXIT
4. Take the OH-303 exit towards PENINSULA/HUDSON 0.2 miles
 - ←
5. Turn LEFT onto W. STREETSBORO RD/OH-303. 0.1 miles
 - ←
6. Turn LEFT onto AKRON-CLEVELAND RD. 0.8 miles
 - 7. Turn RIGHT onto KENDALL PARK RD. 1.0 miles
 - ↑
8. KENDALL PARK RD becomes TRUXELL RD. 1.6 miles
 - 9. Turn RIGHT AT Camp Manatoc entrance. It is a steep hill and a very sharp turn coming from the east. Drive slowly, read the signs, and watch for pedestrians. Check-in at the Campmaster's office. 0.3 miles
